Launched: Settlement and Resettlement Call for Proposal 2024

Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) is proud to announce the launch of the National Call for Proposals (CFP) 2024 for the Settlement and Resettlement Programs. <u>Applications will be accepted</u> <u>until 5 pm EST on January 31, 2024.</u>

IRCC is committed to ensuring newcomers and refugees have the support and services they need to make the most of their talents and experience in order to fully integrate and contribute to the Canadian economy and their communities.

Since our last Call for Proposals in 2019, IRCC has continued to strengthen its evidence base of what works well to meet client needs and where there are opportunities to make changes. Drawing on this evidence and through targeted improvements to our programs, CFP 2024 will ensure that settlement services to newcomers remain effective, efficient, and flexible for newcomers and refugees to receive the support they need when they need it. CFP 2024 will also advance

broader government priorities. To this end CFP 2024 has a distinct focus on equity including through a dedicated Equity Stream, the reinforcement of GBA Plus in proposals to support newcomers who face barriers to integration, Truth and Reconciliation, and support for Francophone immigration.

CFP 2024 is soliciting projects for all Provinces and Territories outside of Quebec under both Programs to begin on April 1, 2025 and will be eligible for a duration of up to five years, ending no later than March 31, 2030.

During the application period, IRCC will host a series of information webinars starting November 21, 2023 until January 24, 2024. Webinars will be offered in English and French, including ones designed for new and lower-capacity applicants, and for each of the three streams. Webinars will be an opportunity for applicants to learn more about CFP 2024 and ask questions through the live Q&A function.

Applicants are also encouraged to consult the <u>2023 Settlement Outcomes Report: Data-driven</u> <u>Insights for the Future of the Settlement Program</u> as it leverages program data and targeted research to better understand newcomers' socioeconomic outcomes. This report will help build the sector's knowledge about newcomer settlement outcomes and serve as a resource for organizations preparing their proposals for CFP 2024.

November 30 Webinar: Human Trafficking


