Summer 'Day Camps' provides a safe, fun and multi-disciplinary educational experience for children and youth on beautiful University campuses, and colleges, in Saskatchewan.

The camps emphasize community and collaboration, and strive to be a welcoming and inclusive space that encourages a lifelong interest in learning.

With a focus on programming that connects to 'lived experiences' and exposes campers to possibilities for their futures, different communities offer a mix of art and design, performing arts activities, health and fitness, eco-science, and a leadership curriculum for each age group. Young people spend the summer exploring, learning and making friends in a post-secondary environment and its many possibilities.

All the campers range in age from 8 to 14 and come from diverse backgrounds.
