

Credential Recognition

The Saskatchewan Credential Recognition Service works to break down barriers that prevent people who were trained in Canada or internationally from working in their regulated occupation. They help doctors, nurses, trades professionals and many others have their training recognized and get to work faster.

Trained in Canada?

Credential Recognition Navigators can help you through the process of transferring your license or getting recertified so you can get to work.

Trained Internationally?

If you are pursuing work in a regulated occupation in Saskatchewan, Credential Recognition Navigators will help you understand the steps you need to take to obtain your license or certification.

Trained health care professionals currently residing or arriving in Saskatchewan could be eligible for up to \$6,000 in grants to support their credential recognition journey.

Credential Recognition Licensure Support

The journey to getting licensed in the occupation you trained for looks different for everyone. Here is an example of some of the steps that you may complete when supported by a credential recognition services navigator to get to work in your regulated occupation or trade.

Client Intake



Complete the registration form and connect to a navigator who will assist you through this process.

Credential Assessment



A regulatory body will assess your training and education for your field of practice. You may need to complete additional training to meet occupational requirements.

Action Plan



Navigators will help you address any gaps in education or training to meet the professions minimum practice standards. You will create an action plan to understand the steps you need to take to get licensed to work.

Assess Grant Eligibility



Our consultants can discuss your eligibility for reimbursement for costs related to becoming licensed in eligible healthcare occupations.

Examination & Testing



You will complete any examinations or assessments that are required by the regulatory body to become licensed.

License Registration



After successful completion of your examinations or testing, you can now apply for a license and register for membership with the regulatory body

Gain Employment



You can now gain employment within your licensed field of practice and fulfill any continued learning requirements.
